



...Special Constables

Special Constables are trained volunteers who have the same powers as regular police officers. They play a crucial role in fighting crime and making our county safer. Specials come from many different backgrounds and walks of life and form a vital link between their community and the Police Service. Once trained, they are required to volunteer a minimum of 16 hours a month.

Are you eligible?

- Are you aged 18 or over
- Have you lived in the UK consecutively for the last 3 years?
- You must meet the minimum requirements of our security vetting

Do you have what it takes?

- Are you passionate about policing?
- Can you commit to 3-4 months of weekend training sessions?
- Can you dedicate a minimum of 16 hours a month of policing duties?

Police Support Volunteers are members of the public who support their local Police in their spare time.
